



Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF)

LCIF is celebrating fifty (50) years of service to the world. During that 50 years LCIF has provided more than \$1 billion US in grants of all sizes to many different areas and communities of the world. Several of them have been to 5M10 communities. A new initiative, Campaign 100, was launched in 2017 and is moving forward rapidly. Part of campaign 100 involves direct benefits back to clubs and districts depending on various levels of contribution. There are new recognition pins available for contributions as well. Melvin Jones Fellowships are still the top recognitions, but there are several others that will interest donors.

District 5M10 has two district LCIF Coordinators, one for Canada and one for the US. They are Lion Susan Hutchinson in Canada and myself, Lion Mel Milender, in the US. As the District Coordinator for LCIF, we are requested to make club visits, zone meeting visits and coordinate with the LCIF coordinator of each club. LCIF is asking each club to appoint an LCIF Coordinator.

If your club would like a visit and short presentation please have your club coordinator let one of us know and it will be arranged. Also, at the midwinter there will be an in depth presentation of Campaign 100. That presentation will provide details of the new initiatives, new grant opportunities and new recognition opportunities. At least one member of each club in attendance should plan to attend the breakout seminar. Additionally, each club is asked to consider increasing the LCIF contribution through the Parade of Green.

Membership Congratulations to all clubs in 5M10!!!!!!

As I write this District 5M10 has a plus 40 new members since July 1st, 2018. That means that everyone is working hard to achieve the goals of the District Governor this year. Membership is and always will be an ongoing priority within our district. We have one new club and we have resurrected a club. Together they are approximately one half of that number. Your attention to this goal means a lot to all of us.

In my years as a Lion, membership has remained a concern, especially in District 5M10. For many years we were in transition, under 1250 members, district wide. We were able to dig out from under that and actually had a couple of years above the transition threshold. However, for numerous reasons, our numbers declined drastically again last year. We, as a district, put a plan in place to again recruit and/or retain more than 1250 members. We applied for and won a membership grant to help us. We are now executing the objectives of that grant and as of this writing your work is showing that it is a good plan.

We still need your assistance! One of the goals of the plan was that every club in District 5M10 would endeavor to end the year (30 June 2019) with one more member than they rostered on 01 July 2018. That is a reasonable goal that can be very difficult to achieve only if you believe it to be hard. There are numerous ideas regarding recruiting but the most effective is to "JUST ASK". Bring local friends to an interesting activity that your club sponsors, let them participate with your club(give them something meaningful to do as part of that participation), tell them about all of the things that Lions do around your community and the world and when they show interest ask them to join. Sounds simple right – it is. Lion Jack Naastad of the Bemidj Lions club recently received Lions recognition for recruiting 50 new members and most of them are because he asked. Ask to see his medal at the midwinter.

The other way in which we all need to work hard is to retain those new members that we recruit. Retention is as important, maybe more so, as recruiting. Clubs and club activities generate interest by making sure that everyone participates as much or as little as they can without feeling they are being left out or are doing too much. Get to know your members and make sure they are involved in both the activities of the club and decision making. They will help you recruit and they will help your club have fun while performing services for your community. They also bring new ideas and ways of doing things. Don't be afraid to try new ideas, new service projects and new leadership. It will surprise everyone.

Get first time Lions to the midwinter Convention. Clubs can help with transportation and lodging. District dues help with registration – there is no registration cost for every new member who joined since the last midwinter convention. In addition, there are activities designed to enlighten them about local and worldwide efforts of Lions.

I challenge you to help your club and your District meet our goals this year.

NOTICE OF VOTE

TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF LION'S DISTRICT SM-10

To the Lions Clubs Delegates of Lions District SM-10:

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the delegates to the Mid-Winter Convention will be asked to vote on the adoption of the Amendments to the District Constitution and By-Laws, as set out below, at the Mid- Winter Convention at Fortune Bay Casino on the weekend of January 25-27, 2019. The District Governor's Cabinet considered and approved putting these amendments to a vote at the October Cabinet meeting.

The Constitution and By-Laws Committee presents the following:

RECOMMENDED AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

For consideration and a Vote at the District Mid-Winter Convention, Fortune Bay Casino, January 26, 2019.

Amend the SM-10 Constitution as follows:

ARTICLE VI, Section 1 amendment:

"The officers of this district shall be the district governor, the immediate past district governor, the first and second vice district governors, the region chairpersons, the zone chairpersons, a cabinet secretary and a cabinet treasurer. At the time of their election and assuming office, (E)ach such officer shall be a member in good standing of a Lions club in good standing in the district."

ARTICLE VI, Section 2 amendment:

"The district shall have a district cabinet composed of ... plus one representative/director of each Lions approved program and such other club members as may be included in this section as amended in accordance with the amendment procedures contained herein. At the time of their appointment and assuming office.

(E)ach_such cabinet member shall be a member in good standing of a Lions club in good standing in the district."

New ARTICLE VI, Section 3:

In the event any officer or cabinet member is a member of a Lions club that loses its good standing, said officer or cabinet member shall receive written notice of the existence and nature of the club's default and 30 days to accomplish the club's return to good standing, or in the alternative to move their membership to an alternate club in good standing. During the said 30 days they shall retain their cabinet position and voting rights.

Any challenge to a cabinet member's <u>standing</u> shall be <u>subject</u> to the <u>dispute requirements</u> set <u>forth in Article VIII of this Constitution</u>.

Renumber existing Section 3 and Section 4.

_Amend the SM-10 Bylaws as follows:

BYLAWS AMENDMENTS:

Article II, Section 7 Add

(c) In addition to meeting the requirements set forth in (b) above, the region chairperson shall have served as a zone chair for at least one full year prior to taking office as region chairperson.

Article III, Section 4:

CABINET SECRETARY <u>TREASURER</u>. He/she shall act under the supervision of the district governor. His/her specific responsibilities shall be to:

- (a) Further the Purposes of this association;
- (b) perform such duties as are implied by the title of said office, including but not by way of limitation thefollowing:
- 1) Keep an accurate record of the proceedings of all meetings of the cabinet, and within five (5) days after each meeting forward copies of the same to all members of the cabinet and the office of Lions Clubs International.
- 2) Take and keep minutes of the sub-district convention and furnish copies of the same to Lions Clubs International, the district governor and the secretary of each club in the sub-district.
 - 3) Make reports to the cabinet as the district governor or cabinet may require.
- 4) Collect and receipt for all dues and taJ{es levied on members and elubs in the sub district, deposit the same in s1:1eh bank or banks as the district governor shall determine and disburse the same byorder of the district governor.
- _____5) Remit and pay over to the m1:1ltiple district eouncil Secretary Treas1:1rer the multiple district dues and tffiCes, if any, eollected in the s1:1b district and sec1:1re a proper receipt.
- e) Keep accurate books and records ofaceo1:1nt, and min1:1tes of all cabinet and s1:1b district meetings, and permit inspection of the same by the district governor, any cabinet member and any call:1b (or authorized agent of any of them) at any reasonable time for any pmper p1:1rpose. Upon dH:cetion of the district governor or the cabinet, he/she shall furnish any s1:1ch books and records as requested to any a1:1ditor appointed by the district governor.
- 7) See1:1re bond for the faithful performance of his/her duties in s1:1eh s1:1m and with s1:1ch s1:1reties as may be reg1:1ired by the district go temor.
- <u>8)</u> Deliver, in a timely manner, at the conclusion of his/her term in office, the generalf.lft6tef <u>fittftfl:eial aeemmts, futtds attd</u> records of the district to his/her successor in office.

- (c) Perform such other functions and acts as may be required <u>of each</u> by directives of the International Board of Directors.
- (d) <u>If separate offices of cabiRet secretary aRd cabinet treasurer are adopted, the duties listed</u> <u>iR (b) are to be attributed to each of the offices according to the Rature of such duties.</u>
- (d) To perform all duties set forth in Article VI, Sections 4, 6 and 7 and Exhibit A, Rules of Procedure for District 5M-10 Convention.

New Section 5:

<u>Section 5 CABINET TREASURER</u> <u>He/she shall act under the supervision of the district governor.</u> <u>His/her specific responsibilities shall be to:</u>

- (a) Further the <u>Purposes</u> of this <u>association</u>:

 (b) <u>perform</u> such duties as are <u>implied by</u> the title of said <u>office</u>, including but not <u>by way</u> of <u>limitation the following</u>:

 1) Keep an accurate record of the <u>receipts</u> and disbursements of the sub-district.

 2) Make <u>reports</u> to the cabinet as the district <u>governor</u> or cabinet <u>may require</u>.

 3) Collect and <u>receipt</u> for all dues and taxes levied on members and clubs in the <u>sub-district</u>, <u>deposit the same in such bank or banks as the district governor shall determine and disburse the same by order of the district governor.</u>
- 4) Remit and <u>pay</u> over to the <u>multiple</u> district council <u>Secretary-Treasurer</u> the <u>multiple</u> district <u>dues and taxes</u>, if any, collected in the <u>sub-district and secure a proper receipt</u>.
- 5) Keep accurate books and records of <u>account</u>, and <u>permit inspection</u> of the same <u>by</u> the district <u>governor</u>, any <u>cabinet member and any club</u> (or authorized agent of any of them) at any reasonable time for any proper purpose. Upon direction of the district governor or the cabinet, he/she shall furnish any such books and records as requested to any auditor appointed by the district governor.
- 6) Secure bond for the faithful <u>performance</u> of his/her duties in such sum and with such sureties <u>as may be required by the district governor.</u>
- <u>7) Deliver.</u> in a <u>timely manner.</u> at the conclusion of his/her term in <u>office</u>, the <u>general</u> and/or <u>financial accounts</u>, <u>funds and records of the district to his/her successor in office</u>.
- 8) Invoice all clubs for their semi-annual dues and give written notice to the treasurer, secretary and president of Lions clubs if they are in default on dues. Providing written notice to all affected cabinet members whose Lions clubs are in default of dues or otherwise not in good standing. Clubs not in good standing shall be identified in a report to the district governor, vice- district governors and cabinet secretary at least 15 days prior to any cabinet meeting.

(c) Perform such other functions and acts as <u>may</u> be <u>required of each by</u> directives of the <u>International Board of Directors</u>.

Renumber Existing Sections 5 through 8

Amend Article V Section 4 of By Laws as follows:

Section 4. REGIONS AND ZONES

(a) Organizational. Regions and zones shall be subject to change by the district governor, when in his/her sole discretion; he/she shall deem the same necessary to the best interests of the district and the association. The district should be divided into regions of twenty four (24) to ten (10) Lions Clubs.

Each Region should be divided into zones of between twelve (12) and four (4) Lions Clubs, giving due regard to the geographic locations of the clubs.

Succession Planning Survey

Report to Cabinet

October 1018

The succession planning survey closed at midnight October 20, 2018. It originally closed September 30th but was extended to try and capture a greater segment of the membership. The results provided some interesting results. The following pages display the results of the survey.

- Out of a possible 1,201 responses, we received 83 responses representing 7% of our total membership.
- Out of a possible 44 clubs, we received responses from members in 18 clubs representing 41% of our clubs.
- From responses received:

DG Interest:

- 5 members indicated they would be interested in becoming a 2nd Vice-District Governor in the future, 53 said no and 18 were undecided
- Of the 5 members that indicated they would be interested in becoming a 2nd Vice-District Governor, 3 members are currently qualified and 2 are not
- From the 3 qualified members, 1 member indicated he/she would be interested in running for 2nd VDG next year, 1 would be interested in 3 years and the 3rd would be interested in 5 years

Zone or Region Chair interest:

- Of the interested and undecided members, 3 indicated they have already been zone chairs and 15 indicated they have not
- Out of the 15 mentioned above, 1 member indicated they would be interested in being a zone chair but is not currently qualified and the remaining 14 were undecided
- 3 members indicated they would likely obtain their qualifications to become zone or region chair within 5 years; 1 each in 1 year, 3 years and 5 years

Cabinet Secretary:

Out of 17 members that were interested or undecided if they would like to run for 2nd
 VDG in the future, 1 member indicated he/she would like to become Cabinet Secretary in 2 years, 6 said they weren't interested and 10 were undecided

Cabinet Treasurer:

Out of 17 members that were interested or undecided if they would like to run for 2nd
 VDG in the future, 4 members indicated they would like to become Cabinet Treasurer in the future, 2 in 2 years and 2 in 5 years, and 13 said they weren't interested

Club President:

- Out of those same 17 members, 4 have been club president and 13 have not
- Out of the 13 members mentioned above, 6 members were interested in becoming club president (2 in 1 year, 1 in 3 years, 2 in 4 years and 1 in > 5 years), 1 was not interested and 6 were undecided

In closing, I believe the survey gave members the opportunity to allow their intentions to be known. It also appears that some members may be being held back because they are not receiving the opportunities to become qualified, which begins at the club level.

I had, previously, indicated that no personal information would be shared with anyone outside of the District Governor Team. I, therefore, have contacted all members that indicated they would be interested in becoming a District Governor in the future, or were undecided, to obtain permission to share the information with their Club's Board of Directors. This is particularly important for those members that require qualifications to move forward.

Out of 17 members that were interested or undecided if they would like to run for 2nd
 VDG in the future, 4 members indicated they would like to become Cabinet Treasurer in the future, 2 in 2 years and 2 in 5 years, and 13 said they weren't interested

Club President:

Out of those same 17 members, 4 have been club president and 13 have not

 Out of the 13 members mentioned above, 6 members were interested in becoming club president (2 in 1 year, 1 in 3 years, 2 in 4 years and 1 in > 5 years), 1 was not interested and 6 were undecided

In closing, I believe the survey gave members the opportunity to allow their intentions to be known. It also appears that some members may be being held back because they are not receiving the opportunities to become qualified, which begins at the club level.

I had, previously, indicated that no personal information would be shared with anyone outside of the District Governor Team. 
