The 5M10 Midwinter Convention—"2020 Vision for Service" will be held in Bemidji, MN, on January 24-25-26, 2020. There will be FUN, FOOD, FELLOWSHIP, and SERVICE. Registration costs now are \$100.00 per Lion, but go up December 1st to \$125.00 each. 1...2...3...ROAR!

We are following our "road map" and we are achieving results.

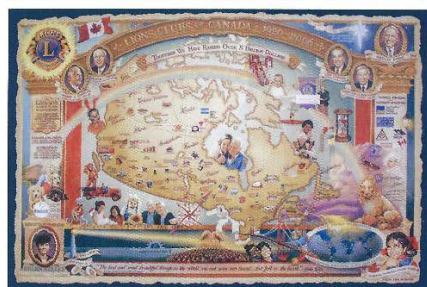
Greetings from 1st Vice District Governor and Technology Chair, Lion Shirley.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

- Lions Clubs first came to Canada in 1920 with the chartering of the "Border Cities Lions Club". This club eventually became known as the "Windsor Lions Club."
- This event led to our Association's name becoming "Lions Clubs International" and it remains so today throughout the world.
- Among other significant contributions to Lionism is that our International Motto "WE SERVE" was submitted to Lions Clubs International by a Lion in Fonthill, Ontario in 1954.
- Countless untold deeds of Service over the years have finally resulted in our reaching the 100th Anniversary of Canadian Lionism.
- Our Canadian Past International Officers are encouraging the Lions of Canada to celebrate our 100th Anniversary in a significant and meaningful way. As Lions we have accepted this challenge.

LIONS 2020

In keeping with our heritage and our commitment to the environment and the generations to follow the 100th Anniversary Committee has chosen the following goals as a fitting way to celebrate our 100th Anniversary.

1. To plant **100,000** trees across Canada
 2. To create a Canadian Lions Centennial project in each Community where Lions are present.
- The 100th Anniversary Celebration begins July 1, 2019 and ends June 30, 2021.
 - All Clubs are asked to report their projects to their District Governor on the form provided. The District Governors are to forward the Club Project Reports to P.I.D. Art Woods or P.I.D. Carl Young at the E-mail address shown.
 - All Clubs who successfully complete their Club Centennial Project and report same to their District Governor will receive a Club Banner Patch acknowledging this accomplishment.
 - District Governors whose Districts raise \$6500.00 CDN. towards a 100th Anniversary Project are to complete the included "Application Form" (Matching L.C.I. Grant Form) and forwarded it to either P.I.D. Art Woods or P.I.D. Carl Young.
 - Upon verification of monies raised an LCI Matching Grant of \$6500.00 will be forwarded to the District Governor to be used for the District Project.

Club awards are for a Model Club or Maple Leaf Club. All donations from 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020 will be applied towards our goals for the Campaign. Also, if we could achieve 100% club participation at the Parade of Green, we would be able to achieve our goals faster. Now that the monies are sent to Ontario this may be possible for clubs who presently don't donate due to Ontario Lottery rules.

Minnesota Lions Diabetes Foundation Update MLDF Funded Research – Partners with the University of Minnesota

Happy Fall and Winter from the Minnesota Lion's Diabetes Foundation (MLDF)! As our days become shorter and we transition to winter, it's still a good time to be active outside. As stated many times before, exercise has been shown to improve overall health in so many ways, including blood sugar control for individuals with diabetes.

This update is about the entity whose research we support, the University of Minnesota (U of MN). The purpose of this update is to confirm that the funds you provide to the MLDF are going to a top diabetes research institution.

The U of MN is one of the top diabetes research facilities in the world. Below is some information provided by the U of MN in support of that statement:

The U of MN has performed the first:

- Human-to-human islet transplantation
- Auto islet transplantation (transplanting one's islets back into one's own body to cure pancreatitis)
- Living-donor pancreas transplant
- Unrelated living-donor transplant
- Reversal of diabetes in twelve monkeys by transplanting islets from pigs
- Islet survival for more than one year without the use of immunosuppressive drugs in monkeys

Progress to date:

- One of only three sites chosen by the National Institute of Health to participate in the Clinical Islet Transplant consortium
- Since 2000, completed seven islet transplants trials with the following post-transplant results:
 - 70% of the recipients have become insulin independent
 - 67% remain insulin independent at one-year post transplant
 - 100% obtained immediate protection from hypoglycemia
 - 94% remain protected from hypoglycemia one year after their first transplant
 - 0% have experienced serious, unexpected adverse effects

Currently the U of MN is:

- Applying to the FDA for a Biologic License Agreement for the commercial manufacture of human islets as a treatment option for people with Type 1 diabetes
- Conducting numerous preclinical trials to translate the innovative research to the clinic

These statements of research confirm that the U of MN is a top diabetes research facility and the MLDF is confident your donated funds are going to the right place. 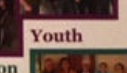

LITPC YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION



The Lions International Trading Pin Club (LITPC) has announced for the 2019 - 2020 school year that there will be 3 US \$2,500 scholarships awarded. Graduating Leos OR graduating sons/daughters, grandsons/granddaughters of Lions or Lioness are eligible to apply for the LITPC Youth Scholarship. The LITPC goal is to help our future leaders and give students a financial helping hand. **Last year the recipients were from Minnesota, Ohio and Oklahoma.** The 2020 recipients will be announced at the LITPC Pin Traders Annual Breakfast in June, 2020.

Selection of the scholarship recipients will be based on academic achievement, an essay stating the student's goals, a statement of reason(s) for applying and an overview of work, community and school service, and letters of recommendation.

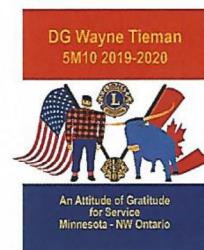
